<p>Worksheet 1 Show the class the images you have prepared and ask them to write down their observations on the worksheet.</p> <p>Class discussion Clothing was used as a status symbol depicting wealth and privilege. Rich people’s clothing was made from the finest silk, wool and linen. Women’s dresses gave them a triangle shape making their waists look thin and slender. Male garments were square which made their chests and shoulders look broad and strong. What are the similarities and differences between male and female dress? What colours were popular? Were the outfits practical? Why did rich people dress this way?</p> <p>Worksheet 2 or 3 Using BICKIDS® PLASTIDECOR® colouring crayons design a Tudor outfit that is fit for Royalty.</p>

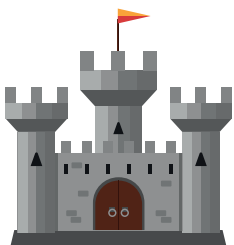
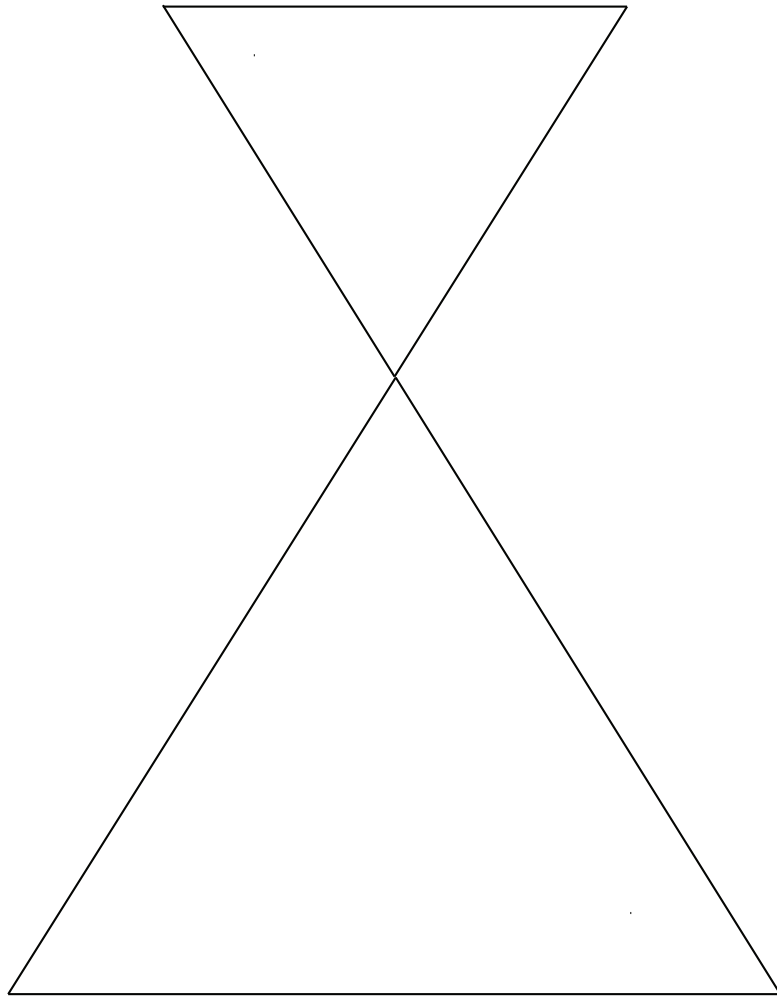
