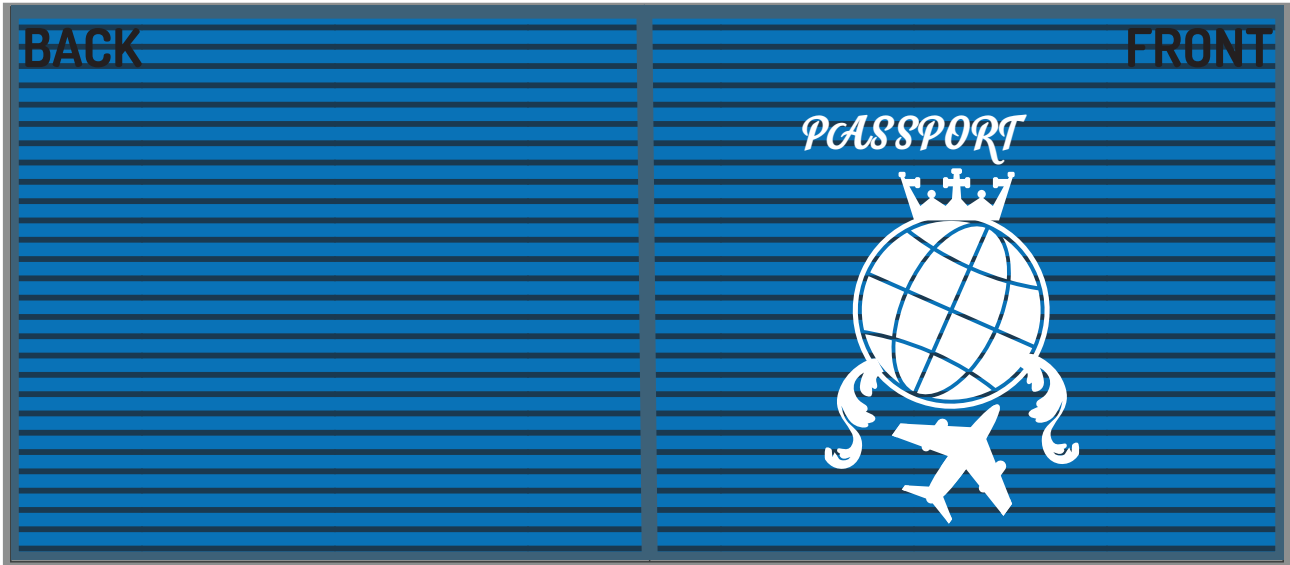


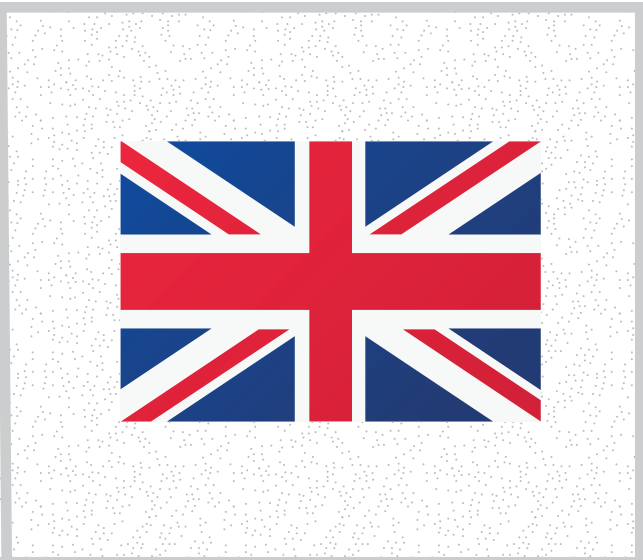

Learning Objectives	Design and make a passport. This activity is part 1 of 5 lessons exploring geography.

Each pupil will need: 1 x A4 coloured card 2 x A4 white paper or card		Fold each piece of A4 in half to make a booklet.
Lesson		
<p>Design a passport Ask each child to design and create their own passport using BICKIDS® ecolutions® EVOLUTION® Pencils. See our example for some inspiration.</p> <p>Step 1 Sketch 4 different passport logos using the Design worksheet. Include monarchy and travel symbols.</p> <p>Step 2 Draw the chosen logo on the folded coloured card. This will be the front cover of the passport.</p> <p>Step 3 Draw a box on one side of folded A4. Using a mirror, draw a self portrait in the box. Include only head and shoulders. Next to the portrait write, Name, Age, Gender etc.</p> <p>Step 4 Draw the flag of their home nation on the other side of A4.</p> <p>Step 5 Place the 2 pieces of A4 inside the passport cover and staple together to make a booklet. One of the A4 pieces will be blank. Here the children will place stamps from the counties they have visited. See World Explorers lessons 2 & 3 for more details.</p>		
Learning Outcomes	Draw a self portrait using a mirror Develop skills in colour, pattern and texture. Explore different design ideas and record them.


